# GENERAL INFORMATION

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## General description

### Introduction

The audio system includes the following functions:

- FM and AM radio;
- terrestrial digital radio DR;
- management of auxiliary audio sources USB;
- Bluetooth® hands-free phone system.

### Radio function

The radio can be used to listen to radio stations on the following bands: FM (frequency modulation) and AM (amplitude modulation).

The DR system (digital terrestrial radio in DAB format, DAB+, T-DMB) improves sound reproduction and enables you to access the "Radio-text" stored radio text information by scrolling the text to display:

- news updates;
- sports news;
- ...



Your hands-free telephone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, but does not remove them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

The RDS system displays the name of some stations or messages sent by the FM radio stations:

- general traffic information (TA);
- emergency messages.

### Hands-free phone function

The hands-free system Bluetooth® allows you to use the following functions without having to handle your phone:

- pair up to six phones;
- make/receive/reject a call;
- transfer the telephone or SIM card phonebook contact list SIM (depending on the phone);
- view the history of calls made using the system (depending on the phone);
- call voicemail.

### Auxiliary audio function

You can listen to your portable digital audio player directly through your

vehicle's speakers. There are several ways to connect your portable audio player, depending on the type of device you have:

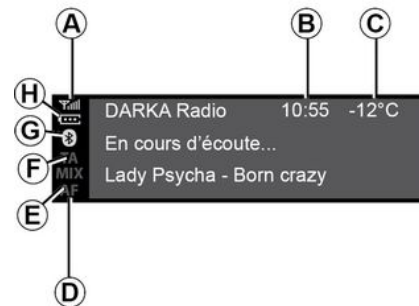
- Bluetooth® connection;
- USB port.

For more information on the list of compatible devices, contact an authorised dealer.

### Bluetooth® function

This function enables the audio system to recognise and control your portable digital audio player or mobile telephone via Bluetooth® pairing.

### Operation

#### On and off

Press briefly on  to switch on your audio system.


The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate


for several minutes. Press  to keep it on for a few more minutes. Switch off the audio system by press-


ing briefly on . The system only displays the time.

#### Choosing the source

Scroll through the various audio sources by repeatedly pressing on

. When scrolling, the audio sources appear in the following order: FM→ DR→ AM→ USB→ Bluetooth®. You can also select the audio source

by pressing on .




When you switch on your radio, the media that was last played should resume. If not, press briefly on .

When you connect a USB media source while the audio system is switched on then the source will automatically switch to the new media and start to play its content.

When you connect a Bluetooth® media source while the audio system is on, if the audio source playing was already Bluetooth® then the media content will switch and start to play automatically on the audio system.

**Note:** press on  or  to display the telephone menu.



#### Volume



Adjust the volume by rotating the  on the panel, or by pressing on  or .


The display shows "Volume" followed by the current setting value.



#### Mute

Simultaneously press on  and . The " MUTE " message is displayed on the screen.

Briefly press on  or  to continue listening to the current audio source.

You can also activate/deactivate the mute function by rotating the  on the panel.


# AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA

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## Listen to the radio

### Select a radio band

Select the desired waveband among FM, AM or DR (terrestrial digital radio)

by repeatedly pressing .

### Selecting a radio station

This mode allows you to search for stations manually, scrolling through the

frequencies by rotating  on the

panel or by pressing  on the steering column to start an automatic search.

## Station memory



This operating mode allows you to listen to your pre-set radio stations.

Select a band (FM, DR, AM, etc.), then select a radio station using the modes described above.

To store a station, press and hold one of buttons 1 to 6, depending on your selection, until you hear a beep.

You can save up to six stations per waveband.

To recall a stored station, briefly press one of buttons 1 to 6 according to your selection.


The list of "Favourites" stations is displayed at the top of the list of stations.

To return to the list of stations, press



## Selecting a radio station


In the AM band, the stations can be browsed by their radio frequency and in the FM or DR band the list of stations can be browsed.

Select the desired band (FM, AM or DR) by repeatedly pressing on .

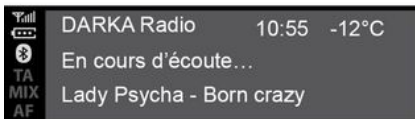
This list can include up to 100 radio stations stored the last time the list was updated.

Rotate the  on the panel to scroll through the radio stations in the FM/DR list.

## Display radio text

To display the "Radio text", press and on .

If no information is provided, "No message" is displayed on the screen.




## Text information "Radio text" ( FM )

Some FM radio stations broadcast text information related to the program playing (e.g. the title of a song, artist

name etc.) Press  to scroll through the "Radio text".



**Note:** this information is only available


for some radio stations. Use  on

the panel or  on the steering column to scroll through the information according to the display style.

## "Radio text" information and news (DR)

This feature allows access to text information recorded on some radio stations. You can scroll through the text to display news updates (economy, politics, health, weather, sports, etc.) using

 on the panel or  on the steering column.

Press  again to return to the radio station currently playing.

## Programme guide (DR)

This feature enables your audio system to display the station's upcoming programs for the day.

**Note:** this information is only available for the selected station's next three time slots.

## Auxiliary audio sources

### USB connection

#### Connect

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.

## AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA

### 1 Using the external audio source

Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus.

#### Note:

- some formats may not be recognised by the system;
- the USB drive in use must be FAT32 formatted and have a maximum capacity of 500 GB.

Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically.


The system automatically restarts the last song played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.



The audio system stores playlists identical to those on your external audio player.

If the external audio source has files, playlists and folders in its directory, the display and playback order on the screen will be as follows:



- « Folders » ;
- « Songs » ;
- « Playlists ».


To access the contents of your external audio source via your audio system:

– press  on the front panel to return to the playlist;



– rotate  on the front panel or  on the steering column to scroll through the tracks;

Then, to modify the current playlist:

– press  on the panel to display the current playlist, then press  to display the folders or selection criteria.

Press  to return to the previous folder;

or

– press  on the panel and confirm by pressing  to select the folder/playlist or to play the selected track.

#### Charging using the USB port

Once the USB plug of your portable digital audio player or phone is connected to the USB port of the audio system, the battery can be charged or the charge level maintained during use.

**Note:** some devices do not recharge or maintain the battery charge level while they are connected to the USB port on the audio system.

#### Bluetooth® audio playback

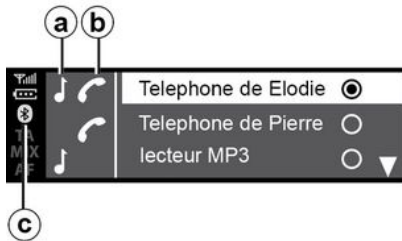
In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Refer to the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

#### Note:

- if your portable digital audio player Bluetooth® is equipped with telephone functions **b** and an audio player **a**, pairing one of these functions will automatically involve pairing the other;
- the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.

# AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA



## Connect

Your portable digital audio player must be connected to the audio system via Bluetooth® **c** or USB in order for you to access all of its features.



Only handle the portable audio player when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable audio player while you are driving.

**Risk of displacement in the event of sudden braking or in the event of an impact.**

For a device already paired, perform the following operations:

- enable the portable digital audio player Bluetooth® connection and make it visible to other devices (for more information please see the user manual for your portable digital audio player);
- select the Bluetooth® audio source

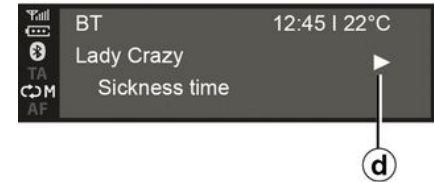
by pressing  or .

## Use



Your portable digital audio player must be connected to the audio system to enable access to all of its features.



**Note:** the portable digital audio player cannot be connected to the audio system unless it has already been paired.

Once the Bluetooth® portable digital audio player is connected, you can control it via your audio system.



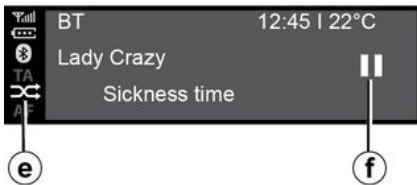
Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically. The "PLAY" symbol **d** is displayed.

Rotate  on the panel or  on the steering column to move to the previous or next track.

Press  and  simultaneously to "PAUSE" **f** the audio track (press again to resume playback).

# AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA

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## Note:

- in some cases, you may need to refer to the user manual for your device in order to finalise the connection procedure;
- The number of accessible functions varies depending on the type of portable player and its compatibility with the audio system.

## Shuffle "MIX"

Press **1 MIX** or press and hold **MODE** to shuffle all the tracks in the folder.

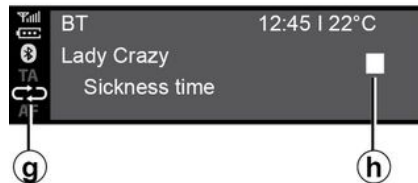
The "MIX " indicator light **e** appears on the screen. A track is then selected at random. The transition from one track to another takes place randomly.

Press **1 MIX** again or press and hold **MODE** to deactivate the shuffle playback: the "MIX " indicator light **e** disappears.

Turning off the audio system deactivates the shuffle function.

**Note:** on a Bluetooth® device that is connected to the audio system, the shuffle applies to the current playlist. Change the folder/playlist to start the random playback.

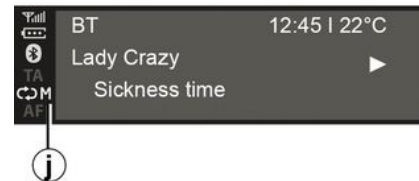
## Repeat "RPT"



This function can be used to repeat the track that is currently playing.

Press **2 RPT** or press briefly on **MODE** to activate the repeat function. The " RPT " warning light **g** appears on the screen.

Press again on **2 RPT** or press briefly on **MODE** to deactivate the repeat function, the " RPT " warning light **g** will disappear.



**Note:** if the shuffle function is activated, this will be automatically deactivated when the repeat function is activated, the " MIX " warning light **e** will disappear and the " RPT " warning light **g** will appear.



## AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA


You can enable the " RPT " and " MIX " functions simultaneously: the warning light *j* will appear on the screen.


### Play mode



The playback mode is shown by the following symbols:

- « PLAY " *d*;
- "PAUSE" *f*;
- « STOP " *h*.

### Pause

Simultaneously press on  and

 to mute the sound or pause the audio track. The symbol *f* appears on the screen.

Press again on  and  simultaneously to activate the sound again or to play the audio track. The symbol *f* disappears from the screen and the warning light *d* appears.

This function is also deactivated if you change the volume or source, or if an automatic news bulletin comes on.



Only handle the portable audio player when traffic conditions permit.

Store the portable audio player safely while driving (risk of being thrown in the event of sudden braking or impact).

# PHONE

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## Pairing/unpairing a phone

### Bluetooth® connection



To activate the audio system's Bluetooth® function:

- press **TEL** or to access the "Phone" menu;
- select "BT ON/OFF" using the on the steering column control or on the panel, then press **OK** or **MODE** to confirm;

– select "YES" using on the steering column control or on the panel, then press **OK** or **MODE** to confirm.

### Pairing a phone

To use your hands-free system, pair your Bluetooth® mobile phone with the vehicle. Check that your phone's Bluetooth® function is activated and set its status to "visible".

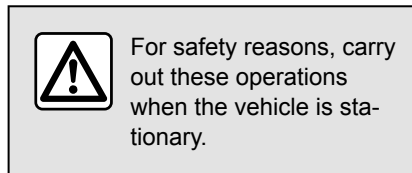
Pairing will enable the hands-free phone system to recognise and store a phone.

You can pair up to six phones, but only one can be connected at a time.

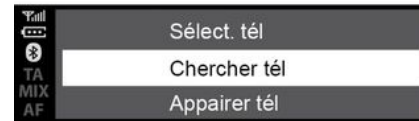
Pairing can be performed from the audio system or from your phone.

Your audio system and phone must both be switched on.

**Note:** if you pair a new phone while another phone is already connected to the audio system, it will be disconnected and replaced by the new paired phone.



For safety reasons, carry out these operations when the vehicle is stationary.





### Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via the audio system



This method allows you to make a Bluetooth® search from the audio system.

To pair a phone, carry out the following operations:

- activate Bluetooth®;
- press **TEL** or to access the "Phone" menu;



# PHONE

– select "Search for a phone" using  on the steering column or 

on the front panel, then  or  to confirm.

The search for Bluetooth® devices in the vicinity will begin (this search may take up to approximately 60 seconds.)

Select the telephone that you wish to

pair by rotating  on the steering column or  on the panel, then

press  to confirm.

From your Bluetooth® device, accept the pairing request.

When the "Connected" message is displayed on the audio system screen, the Bluetooth® device is automatically stored and connected to the vehicle.

Your device is then visible in the list of recognised phones which can also be accessed in the "Select a phone" sub-menu.

If the pairing has not been successful after 60 seconds, the "Pairing failed" message appears. Repeat these operations to carry out the desired action. Please refer to your telephone's user guide for further information.



**Note:** depending on your phone, it may be useful to accept the transfer of your phonebook and call history.




## Pairing a Bluetooth® phone with the audio system via your phone

This method allows you to make a Bluetooth® search from your phone.

To pair your phone, carry out the following operations:

– activate Bluetooth®;

– press  or  to access the "Phone" menu;

– select "Pair phone" using  on the front panel, then  or  to confirm.

The "Enter the code: XXXXXX" message appears on the audio system screen and a 60 seconds countdown starts.

The audio system is then visible to other Bluetooth® devices for approximately 60 seconds.

Search for the audio system using your telephone, then select it (see your telephone user manual) or accept the pairing code with your telephone.

The "MY CAR connected" or "R&Go Multimédia" message is displayed on the audio system screen to confirm

that your telephone is paired and connected with your audio system.

The "R&Go Multimédia" message is displayed on the screen only if the R&Go application connects to the audio system and if the application is installed on your smartphone.

If pairing fails, the audio system display returns to the "Phone" menu.

If the maximum limit of phones paired with the audio system is reached, you need to unpair an existing phone before pairing a new one (refer to the information on "Unpairing a phone" in this section).










# PHONE

## 1 Unpairing a telephone



Unpairing enables you to delete a phone from the hands-free telephone system memory:

- press  or  to access the "Phone" menu;
- select the "Delete a phone" menu using the  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then press  or  to confirm;
- select "YES" using  on the steering column control or  on the

panel, then press  or  to confirm.

A message is displayed on the audio system screen asking you to confirm your choice (as shown in the illustration).

If six phones are already stored, the system offers to delete one of the devices. By selecting "YES", you will be redirected to the "Delete a phone" menu.

## Connecting/disconnecting a phone

### Connecting a paired phone

Your phone must be connected to the hands-free phone system in order to use all its functions.

A telephone cannot be connected to the hands-free telephone system unless it has previously been paired.

Please refer to the information on "Pairing a phone" in the "Pairing/unpairing a phone" section.

**Note:** your phone's Bluetooth® connection must be activated and set to "visible".

### Automatic connection

As soon as the vehicle ignition is switched on, the audio system searches for paired telephones in the vicinity.

**Note:** the last phone to have been connected is given priority.

Searching will continue until a paired telephone is found (this may take several minutes).

**Note:** for more information on the list of compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer:

- you can use automatic telephone connection with the ignition switched on. You may need to activate the automatic Bluetooth® connection function on your hands-free phone system. To do this, refer to your phone user manual;
- when reconnecting, and when two paired phones are within range of the hands-free system, the last phone to have been connected will take priority, even if this phone is outside the vehicle but within range of the hands-free system.

**Note:** if a call is already in progress when your hands-free telephone system is connected, the telephone will connect automatically and the conversation audio will switch to the vehicle speakers.

Your hands-free phone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, without removing them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.



For safety reasons, carry out these operations when the vehicle is stationary.



## Manual connection (changing the phone connected)

- press **TEL** or to access the "Phone" menu;
- rotate the on the steering column control or on the panel until you reach the "Select a phone" menu, then **OK** to confirm.



The list of phones already paired is displayed.  
Select the phone that which you wish to connect using on the steering

column or on the panel, then

press **OK** to confirm.

A message will appear to confirm that the telephone is connected.

**Note:** if a phone is already connected, when selecting another phone from the list of phones already paired, the existing connection is automatically replaced by that of the new phone requested.

## Connection failure

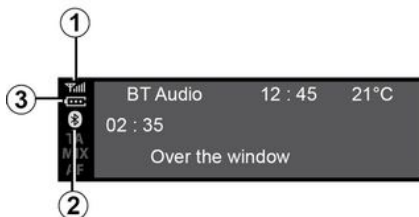
If connection fails, check that:

- your phone is switched on;
- your phone battery is not flat;
- your phone has already been paired to the hands-free telephone system;
- Bluetooth® is now enabled on your phone and on the audio system;
- the phone is configured to accept the audio system's connection request.

**Note:** using your hands-free telephone system for prolonged periods will discharge your phone's battery more quickly.

# PHONE

## 1 Telephone information



Once connected, the audio system displays telephone-related information:

- the telephone network status **1**;
- the telephone battery level **2**;
- the type of connection to the multimedia system **3**.

## Disconnect a phone



To disconnect your telephone, you can:

- deactivate the Bluetooth® function on your audio system;
- deactivate your phone's Bluetooth® function;
- delete the paired phone via the audio system. Please refer to the information on "Unpairing a phone" in the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

A message is then displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that the phone is disconnected.

### Note:

- if the phone is switched off it will also be disconnected;

– If a call is in progress when the telephone is disconnected, the call will be automatically transferred to your telephone.






To disable your smartphone's Bluetooth®, refer to your phone's user guide.


To unpair and delete the Bluetooth® phone, see the information under "Unpairing a phone" in the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

## Making/receiving a call

### Calling a contact from the telephone directory

When pairing a phone, its phonebook is automatically uploaded into the audio system (depending on the phone).


- press on  or  to access the "Phone" menu;
- select "Phonebook" using  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then  to confirm.



**Note:** you can call a number or contact by pressing briefly on  (see the "Using voice recognition" section).

# PHONE




From the "Phonebook" menu you can search for a contact by name. To do this:


– press  to display the digital keyboard;



– use  on the panel or  on the steering column control to scroll through the letters of the alphabet;

– when you have selected the desired


letter, press  on the panel to confirm;



– select the desired contact using

 on the steering column control or

 on the panel, then press  to view the saved contact number(s);

– select the desired number using

 on the steering column control or

 on the panel, then press  to confirm and make the call.

**Note:** to return to the previous screen,

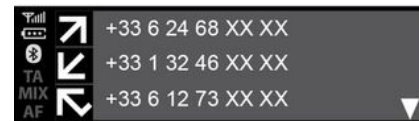

## Call a contact from your call log history

To display the call history:

– press  or press briefly on  to access the "Phone" menu;


– select "Calls" by pressing  on the steering column control or  on

– Select the contact or number you want to call by pressing  on the panel or  on the steering wheel


## Making a call by dialling a number


To make a call by dialling the number:

– press **TEL** or press briefly on  to access the "Phone" menu;

– select "Dial" by pressing  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then press **OK** to confirm;

– select each digit by pressing  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then press **OK** to confirm;

– once the number has been dialled, press **TEL**,  on the panel or  to make the call.

You can recall the last number dialed by pressing and holding on **TEL** or .

## Receiving a call

When receiving a call, the caller's number is displayed on the audio system screen (this function depends on the options you have subscribed to with your telephone service provider).





If the caller's number is in one of the memories, the name of the caller is displayed instead of the number.





If the caller's number cannot be displayed, the "Private number" message is displayed on the audio system screen.



It is recommended that you stop your vehicle before entering a number or searching for a contact.

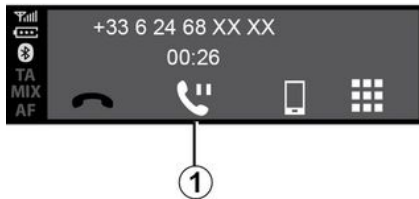





To accept an incoming call, press **TEL** or . You can also select  using  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then **OK** to confirm and accept the incoming call.

To reject a call, press and hold **TEL** or . You can also select  using  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then press **OK** to confirm and reject the call.




# PHONE




To put an incoming call on hold, select **1** by pressing  on the steering column control or  on the panel, then press  to confirm and put the incoming call on hold.

## Receiving a second call




When receiving a second call, the second caller's number is displayed on the audio system screen (this function depends on the options you have subscribed to with your telephone service provider). You can:


- accept the incoming call by selecting  ;

- reject the incoming call by selecting  ;
- put an incoming call on hold by selecting **1**.



## During a call


You can:

- adjust the volume by rotating  on the audio system panel or by pressing  or  on the steering column control;




- hang up by pressing .



You can also:

- accept the incoming call/resume a call placed on hold by selecting  ;
- hang up by selecting  during the conversation;
- put a call on hold by selecting **1**.

 The system allows managing call waiting when your phone is connected (depending on your plan).

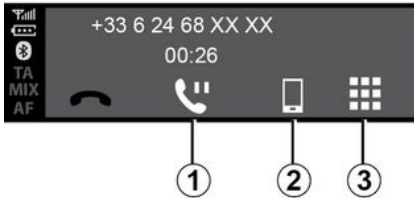

### Introduction

The audio system includes the following functions:

- FM and AM radio;
- terrestrial digital radio DR;
- management of USB auxiliary audio sources;
- Bluetooth® hands-free phone system.

### Radio function

The radio can be used to listen to radio stations on the following bands: FM (frequency modulation) and AM (amplitude modulation).

The DR system (digital terrestrial radio in DAB format, DAB+, T-DMB) improves sound reproduction and enables you to access the "Radio text" stored radio text information by scrolling the text to display:

- news updates;
- sports news;
- ...



Your hands-free telephone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, but does not remove them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

The RDS system displays the name of some stations or messages sent by the FM radio stations:

- general traffic information (TA);
- emergency messages.

### Hands-free phone function

The hands-free system Bluetooth® allows you to use the following functions without having to handle your phone:

- pair up to six phones;
- make/receive/reject a call;

- transfer the telephone or SIM card phonebook contact list SIM (depending on the phone);
- view the history of calls made using the system (depending on the phone);
- call voicemail.

### Auxiliary audio function

You can listen to your portable digital audio player directly through your vehicle's speakers. There are several ways to connect your portable audio player, depending on the type(s) of device you have:

- Bluetooth® connection;
- USB port.


For more information on the list of compatible devices, contact an authorised dealer.



### Bluetooth® function

This function enables the audio system to recognise and control your portable digital audio player or mobile telephone via Bluetooth® pairing.

### Operation

#### On and off

Briefly press on  to switch on your audio system.






The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate for several minutes. Briefly press  to keep it on for a few more minutes. Switch off the audio system by pressing and holding on . The radio system display is shown in the illustration while switched off or in "Vehicle" mode with the sound muted.

### Choosing the source

Scroll through the various audio sources by repeatedly pressing on



. When scrolling, the audio sources appear in the following order: FM→ DR→ AM→ USB→ Bluetooth®. You can also select the audio source from the "Media" world.

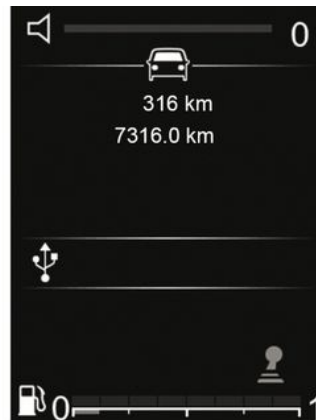

## USB connection

### Connect

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.


### Use




Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically.

The audio system automatically restarts the last track played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.



Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus. It stores playlists identical to those of your external audio player.


To access the contents of your external audio source via your audio system:

– press  to return to the playlist;  
or

– rotate the  on the steering column control or press  or  to scroll through the tracks.

Then, to modify the current playlist:

– press  to display the folders or selection criteria. Press again on  to return to the previous folder;  
or

– press  to select the folder, playlist or to listen to the selected track.

### Charging using the USB port

Once the USB plug of your portable digital audio player or telephone is connected to the USB port of your audio system (located near the driver's position in the passenger compartment) it will be possible to charge or maintain the battery level during use.

**Note:** some devices do not recharge or maintain the battery charge level while they are connected to the USB port on the audio system.

## Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Refer to the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

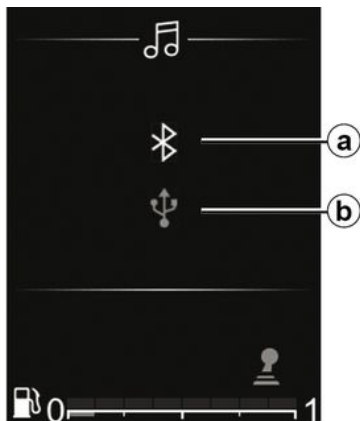
Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

### Note:

– if your Bluetooth® digital device is equipped with telephone and portable digital audio player functions, pairing one of these functions will automatically pair the other;  
– the number of functions which can be accessed depends on the type of portable digital audio player and its compatibility with the audio system.

## AUDIO/MULTIMEDIA

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### Connecting to the vehicle

Your portable digital audio device must be connected to the audio system via Bluetooth® **a** or USB **b** in order for you to access all of its features.



Only handle the portable audio player when traffic conditions permit.

For a device already paired, perform the following operations:

**Note:** your phone's Bluetooth® connection must be activated and set to "visible".

### Automatic connection

As soon as the vehicle ignition is switched on, the audio system searches for paired telephones in the vicinity.

**Note:** the last phone to have been connected is given priority.

Searching will continue until a paired telephone is found (this may take several minutes).

**Note:** for more information on the list of compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer:

– you can use automatic telephone connection with the ignition switched on. You may need to activate the auto-

– when reconnecting, if two paired phones are within range of the hands-free system, the last phone to have been connected will take priority, even if this phone is outside the vehicle but within range of the hands-free system;

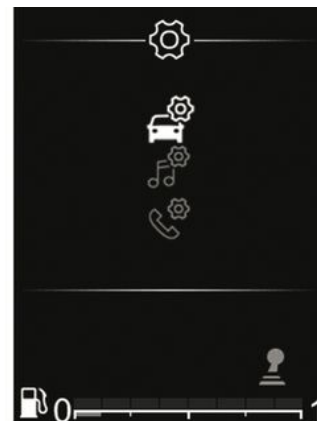
– if a call is already in progress when your hands-free telephone system is connected, the telephone will connect automatically and the conversation audio will switch to the vehicle speakers.








Your hands-free phone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, without removing them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.






- the telephone network status **3**.

### Disconnect a phone



To disconnect your telephone, you can:

- deactivate the Bluetooth® function on your audio system;
- deactivate your phone's Bluetooth® function;
- delete the paired phone via the audio system. Please refer to the information on "Unpairing a phone" in the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

If the phone is switched off, the phone will be disconnected.

A message is then displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that the phone is disconnected.

**Note:** if a call is in progress when the phone is disconnected, the call will be automatically transferred to your phone.

When pairing a phone, its phonebook is automatically uploaded into the audio system (depending on the phone).



## Introduction

The audio system includes the following functions:

- FM and AM radio;
- terrestrial digital radio DR;
- management of USB BT Audio auxiliary audio sources;
- Bluetooth® hands-free phone system.

## Radio function

The radio can be used to listen to radio stations on the following bands: FM (frequency modulation) and AM (amplitude modulation).

The DR system (digital terrestrial radio in DAB format, DAB+, T-DMB) improves sound reproduction and enables you to access the "Radio text" stored radio text information by scrolling the text to display:

- news updates;
- sports news;
- ...



Your hands-free telephone system is only intended to facilitate communication by reducing the risk factors, but does not remove them completely. Always comply with the laws of the country in which you are travelling.

The RDS system displays the name of some stations or messages sent by the FM radio stations:

- general traffic information (TA);
- emergency messages.

## Hands-free phone function

The hands-free system Bluetooth® allows you to use the following functions without having to handle your phone:

- pair up to six phones;
- make/receive/reject a call;
- transfer the telephone or SIM card phonebook contact list SIM (depending on the phone);
- view the history of calls made using the system (depending on the phone);
- call voicemail.

## Auxiliary audio function

You can listen to your portable digital audio player directly through your

vehicle's speakers. There are several ways to connect your portable audio player, depending on the type(s) of device you have:

- Bluetooth® connection;
- USB port.




For more information on the list of compatible devices, contact an authorised dealer.

## Bluetooth® function


This function enables the audio system to recognise and control your portable digital audio player or mobile telephone via Bluetooth® pairing.

## Operation


### On and off

Briefly press on ,  or  to switch on your audio system.

The audio system can be used with the vehicle ignition off. It will operate

for several minutes. Briefly press  to keep it on for a few more minutes.

Switch off the audio system by press-

ing and holding on . The radio system display is shown in the illustra-

Your audio system is equipped with a USB port as well as a Bluetooth® connection which can be used to connect external audio sources.

**Note:** the auxiliary audio source formats include MP3, WMA and AAC.

## USB connection

### Connect

Connect the plug of the MP3 player, portable digital audio player or USB drive to the USB port.

Once the device is connected, the track will be displayed automatically.


### Use




Once the external audio source is connected, the first audio track will start to play automatically.

The audio system automatically restarts the last track played if the external audio player was previously connected to the audio system.



Once your external audio source is connected, its contents can be accessed via the multimedia system menus. It stores playlists identical to those of your external audio player.


To access the contents of your external audio source via your audio system:

– press  to return to the playlist;  
or

– rotate the  on the steering column control or press  or  to scroll through the tracks.

Then, to modify the current playlist:

– press  to display the folders or selection criteria. Press again on  to return to the previous folder;  
or

### Charging using the USB port

## Bluetooth® audio playback

In order to use your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device, you must pair it to the vehicle upon first use. Refer to the "Pairing, unpairing a phone" section.

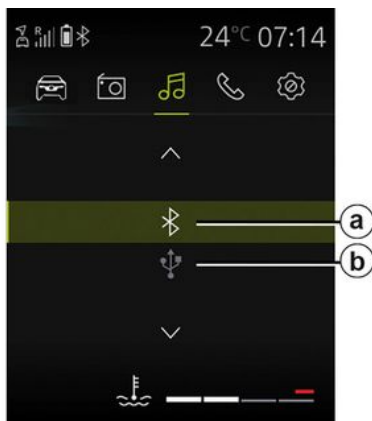
Pairing enables the audio system to recognise and store a Bluetooth® portable digital audio device.

### Note:

– if your Bluetooth® portable digital audio device is equipped with telephone and portable audio player functions, pairing one of the functions will automatically involve pairing the other;

### Automatic connection

As soon as the vehicle ignition is switched on, the audio system searches for paired telephones in the vicinity.

Searching will continue until a paired telephone is found (this may take several minutes).

**Note:** for more information on the list of compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer:

– you can use automatic telephone connection with the ignition switched on. You may need to activate the auto-

– when reconnecting, if two paired phones are within range of the hands-free system, the last phone to have been connected will take priority, even if this phone is outside the vehicle but within range of the hands-free system;

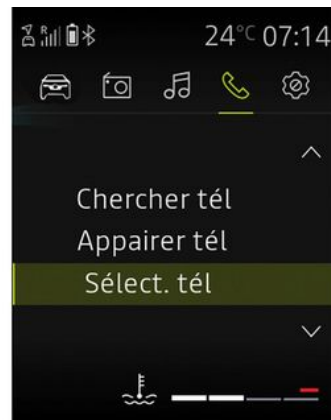
– if a call is already in progress when your hands-free telephone system is connected, the telephone will connect automatically and the conversation audio will switch to the vehicle speakers.

### Manual connection (changing the phone connected)

If the phone is switched off, the phone will be disconnected.

A message is then displayed on the audio system screen to confirm that the phone is disconnected.

A journey has to be more than 400 metres to be taken into account. If the time between the stopping and starting

the engine is less than four hours, the application continues to take the journey into account before stopping.

Use this function to view your instantaneous fuel consumption compared to your vehicle's average consumption and to observe your driving behaviour.

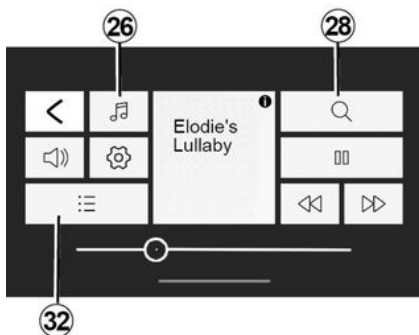

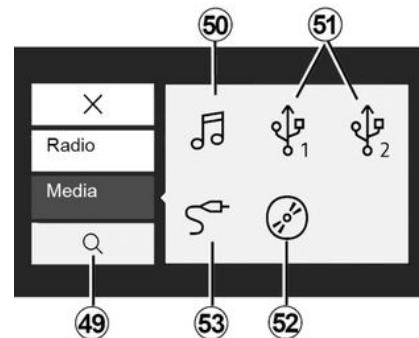

- search for a station using the integrated intelligent keypad;
- listen to stored stations;
- view text information from certain "FM", "DR" or "AM" radio stations while listening.

For further information, please refer to the section on "Listening to the radio".

## "Media"



This menu enables you to listen to music from an external source. Select a connected input source to access the audio files from the following list:

## R&GO MULTIMEDIA FUNCTION

**50.** Access multimedia files saved on the smartphone;

**51.** access multimedia files saved on a MP3 player or USB device;

**52.** access multimedia files stored on a CD (depending on equipment);

**53.** access multimedia files on a source connected to the audio system Jack socket.

The search feature offers the following functions:

**54.** search by podcast;

**55.** search by title;

**56.** search by album;

**57.** search by genre;

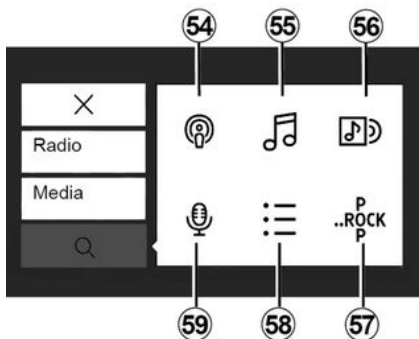
**58.** search in playlists;

**59.** search by artist.

### Note:

– only available sources can be selected. Unavailable sources are greyed out;

– in the case of playing a multimedia file, R&Go does not control external apps.



### « Search »

You can access the function from the multimedia menu by pressing the "Search" icon **28**.

You can use this menu to search a multimedia file on the external audio source selected.

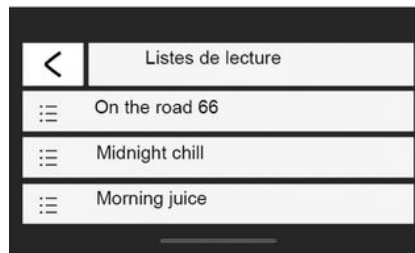
You can access the function from the multimedia menu by pressing **32** or **58** "Playlists" from the multimedia menu.

This menu allows you to access your custom playlists.

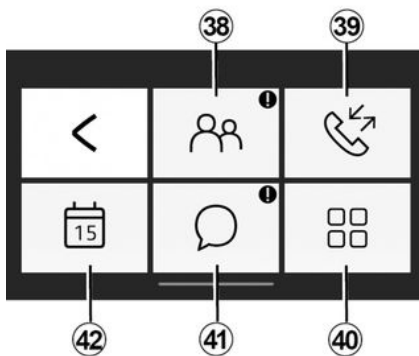

### « Phone »

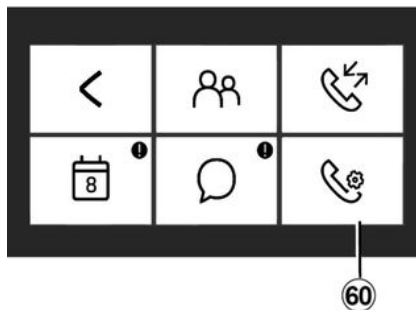
To access the "Phone" menu from the default "R&Go" main menu, press the "Phone" button.

The "Phone" menu consists of several icons:

**38.** Access the phonebook;

**39.** access your call log;

**40.** dial a number using the digital keypad, depending on your phone model;



**41.** access messages received on your smartphone or tablet;

**42.** access your "Calendar";

**60.** access the "Phone" menu settings, depending on your phone model.

**Note:** you can listen to your telephone voicemail by pressing and holding the "1" button on the radio panel keypad.

First, press and hold the "1" button on the radio panel keypad to save your phone voicemail number.

### « Contacts »

Press the "Contacts" icon to access the phonebook on your phone Bluetooth®.

After connecting your audio system with your Bluetooth® phone using

Bluetooth® wireless technology, your phonebook contact numbers can be accessed via the "R&Go" app.

Select the contact (if the contact has more than one number, you will be requested to select the number to call). The call will be started automatically after you press the contact's number.

When an address is linked to a contact, you can launch the navigation application. To do this, press the navigation icon to navigate to the stored address.

**Note:** to scroll through the list of contacts, slide your finger upwards on your smartphone screen.

### "Call log"

Use the call log to see:

- outgoing calls;
- missed calls;
- incoming calls.

When you view the call history list, the contacts are displayed from the most recent to the oldest.

To navigate through the call log, slide your finger upwards on your smartphone screen.

To make a call from the call history list, select the contact that you wish to call from the list.

### "Phone settings"

## R&GO TELEPHONE FUNCTION

Depending on your phone model, this function enables you to access the "Phone" menu settings and to configure certain options.

### « Dial »

Depending on your phone model, the "Dial" function enables you to dial a phone number and call a contact via the "R&Go" app.

To dial a number, press the number buttons. When you have completed the number you wish to call, press the

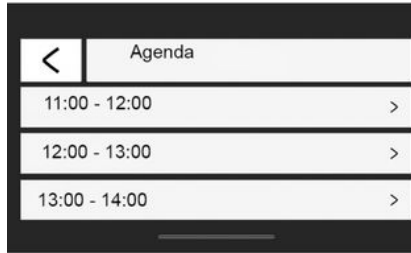


button to make the call.

### "Messages"

The "Messages" function can be used to read and/or listen to text messages received while the "R&Go" app is in use.

**Note:** to scroll through the list of messages, slide your finger upwards on your smartphone screen.



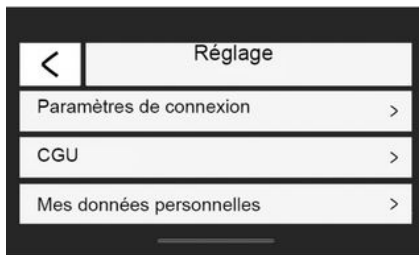
### "Calendar"

The "Calendar" function can be used to access all entries (daily appointments, events, etc.) stored on the calendar of your phone or tablet. If a postal address is associated with an event, you can launch the navigation app to navigate to that location. To do this, press the navigation icon to navigate to the stored address.



It is recommended that you stop your vehicle before entering a number or searching for a contact.

# R&GO ADJUSTING THE SETTINGS



## "Settings"

To access the settings menu from the default "R&Go" main menu, press the "Settings" button.

The "Settings" menu for the "R&Go" system can be used to adjust or view the following:

- run the "R&Go" automatically once connected to the audio system;
- information on your user account;
- the terms and conditions of use;
- the connection to the audio system;
- the instruction tutorial for the app;
- the shortcut button to return to the "R&Go" app;
- restore default settings;

- the "R&Go" version installed on your phone;
- the Bluetooth® connection (automatic or manual);
- ...

## "Connection settings"

### "Pairing"

This function allows you to activate the Bluetooth® function on your phone and to search the audio system MY CAR ».

### "Launch R&Go"

Select this option to activate or deactivate the automatic launch of the application as soon as the connection to your vehicle's audio system is established.

### « CGU »

This option allows you to view the terms and conditions of use.

## "My personal data"

This option enables you to view personal data protection information.

### « Hotline »

This option allows you to view the data required for manufacturer support.

## "Tutorial"

You can use this function to view the instruction tutorial for the "R&Go" app.

## "Default settings"

This option enables you to return to the default settings.

## "Activate the R&Go information"

Tick to activate or deactivate the display of the application shortcut button. This function requires a system authorisation in order to be used. This button can only be seen when you are outside the "R&Go" app. When you press the shortcut button, the "R&Go" app will open.

## "Statistics monitoring"

This function allows you to activate or deactivate data transfer to a dedicated statistics tool.

## "R&Go Version"

This option allows you to check your application version.

# USING VOICE RECOGNITION

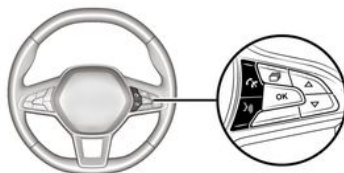
## Voice recognition system

The audio system can be used to operate voice recognition via your smartphone (if compatible). This makes it possible to control the functions of your smartphone by voice, while keeping your hands on the steering wheel.

### Note:


- your smartphone's voice recognition system only enables you to use the functions provided with your smartphone. It does not enable you to interact with the other audio system functions, such as the radio etc.
- when using voice recognition, the audio system will use the language set on your smartphone;
- if you try to use your vehicle's voice recognition system with a paired smartphone that is not equipped with voice recognition, a message will be displayed on the audio system screen to notify you.

## Using voice recognition with your phone




### Activation

To activate the voice recognition system, you must:

- have a 3G, 4G signal or WIFI on your smartphone;
- activate the Bluetooth® function on your smartphone and make it visible to other devices (refer to your smartphone user manual);
- pair and connect your smartphone to the audio system (refer to the section on "Pairing, unpairing a phone");
- press briefly on  to activate the function, then speak (a beep indicates that voice recognition is activated).

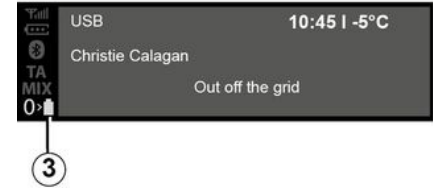
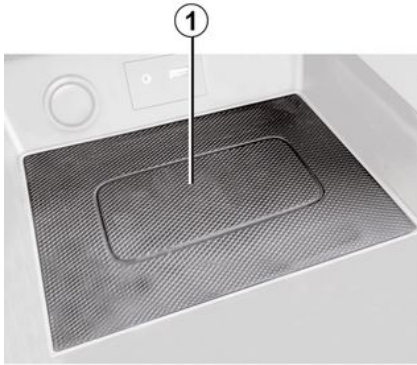
### Deactivation

Press and hold on .

An audible signal indicates that voice recognition is deactivated.

# WIRELESS CHARGER

## Introduction



The induction charging area **1** can be used to charge a telephone without a cable.

If the vehicle is equipped, the charging area is indicated by (depending on the vehicle):

- an associated symbol;

and/or

- the charging status is automatically displayed on the screen as long as the phone is positioned in the dedicated area.

Its location may vary depending on the vehicle. Please refer to the vehicle user manual for further information.

### Note:

- for more information on compatible phones, please contact an approved dealer or visit the manufacturer's web-site;
- to enable optimal charging, it is preferable to remove the protective case from your phone before charging;
- the entire surface of the phone must be aligned with the surface of the charging mat to enable optimum charging.

## Charging procedure

Position your telephone **2** in the induction charging area **1**. Charging is automatically started and the charging progress **3** is displayed on the screen.

Phone charging **2** is interrupted in the following cases:

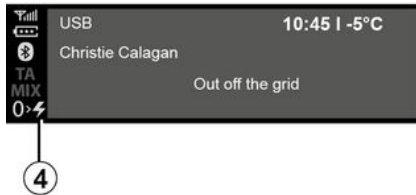
- an object is detected in the induction charging zone **1**;
- the induction charging zone **1** is overheating. Once the temperature has dropped, your phone's charging procedure **2** will soon restart.



# WIRELESS CHARGER

**i** Objects left in the induction charging area **1** may over-heat. You are advised to place them in the areas provided for this purpose (storage compartment, sun visor compartment etc.).

## Charging progress



The charging progress is displayed on the audio system panel:

- charging complete **3**;
- charging in progress **4**;
- metallic object detected **5**.



**i** It is essential not to leave any objects (USB drive, SD card, credit card, starting card, jewellery, keys, coins, etc.) in the induction charging zone **1** when charging your phone. Remove any magnetic cards or credit cards from the phone case before positioning your telephone in the induction charging area **1**.

## OPERATING FAULTS

Description	Possible causes	Solutions
No sound can be heard.	The mobile phone is not plugged in or connected to the system. The volume is set to minimum or the audio is paused.	Ensure that the mobile phone is connected to the system. Increase the volume or deactivate pause.
The audio system does not work and the display does not light up.	The audio system is not switched on.	Switch the audio system on.
	The audio system fuse has blown.	Replace the fuse (see the section on "Fuses" in the vehicle user manual).
The audio system does not work but the display lights up.	The volume is set to minimum.	Press <b>19</b> or rotate <b>1</b> .
	Speaker short circuit.	Consult an approved dealer.
No sound comes from the left or right-hand speakers.	The sound balance setting (left/right) is incorrect.	Correct the sound balance setting.
	Speaker disconnected.	Consult an approved dealer.
Poor radio reception or no reception.	The vehicle is too far from the transmitter to which the radio is tuned (background noise and interference).	Search for another transmitter with a better local signal.
	The reception is disrupted by interference from the engine.	Consult an approved dealer.
	The aerial is damaged or not connected.	Consult an approved dealer.
